

Local History

- At Key Stage 2 and Key Stage 3, students are required to complete a Local History Study.
- Remembrance and War Memorials are often very useful routes into local history studies. The box can provide a clear link between the different reasons that we Remember people and the ways in which we choose to remember them, including the significance of local memorials.
- Students can use the box in class and then visit a local memorial to learn more about the impact of the war on their locality.
- The Imperial War Museums Group holds the War Memorials Register; this can be used to find memorials close to you, and can be accessed by visiting www.iwm.org.uk/memorials/search
