DISCOVERING JUDAISM

Discovering Judaism is a series of interactive and multi-sensory workshops designed to encourage pupils to learn about the vibrancy of Jewish religion and culture today. Students will explore Judaism through key objects, contemporary films and guided discussions to understand what it means to be Jewish in Britain today.



Torah



EXPLORING HISTORY

Exploring History is a programme of object-based interactive workshops designed to engage students with the history of Jewish religion and culture in Britain. Workshops encourage pupils to understand the complexity of people's lives, the process of change, the diversity of societies, and relationships between different groups.

Key Stage: 2



Jewish East End

Discover the stories of real people and communities who migrated to London's changing East End in the early 20th century and the challenges they faced embarking on their new lives in Britain. Explore changing identities by looking closely at key objects to discover the impact of living in a new and diverse environment. Using historical enquiry skills students will be able to consider the challenges faced by immigrants to Britain and the positive impact they can make.

INVESTIGATING THE HOLOCAUST

Our sensitive and thought-provoking workshops for years 5 and 6 focus on key artefacts from our collection and personal testimony of those rescued by the Kindertransport, the rescue of 10,000 unaccompanied child refugees who came to Britain in 1938–39. Students will build on their prior knowledge of life in Europe in the run-up to the outbreak of World War II. All sessions are led by our highly experienced team of Holocaust experts who are specially trained to deal with the delivery of this sensitive topic to young children.

Discover the story of a spice box that was hidden in Germany and the impact Nazi rule had on one family. Explore the Jewish tradition of Shabbat and Havdalah and reflect on the impact of the Kindertransport through key themes of identity and tolerance.

Cooking with Bubbe

Launching in 2022, this three-year programme will bring together children and young people, families and older people in hands-on learning about food culture and heritage.

Cooking with Bubbe is a cross-curricular programme which combines RE and Food Tech. Students will be able to learn about key Jewish festivals and the food that goes with them. Pair this with one of our festival workshops and watch the festivals come to life as students make challah for Shabbat, matzah for Passover and hamentaschen for Purim.

Our former cafe space will be transformed into a food learning space during autumn 2021. We will be installing kitchen equipment that is safe and easy for children and young people. We will also be bringing out objects from our collection with links to food, culture and heritage including koshering boards, lokshen rolling pins and recipe books.


