



Journey to the Kindertransport (KS2, Years 5 + 6 only)

Summary:

Explore artefacts to contextualise what life was like in Nazi-occupied Europe, and the circumstances that prompted the Kindertransport. Reflect on the impact of the Kindertransport on individuals' lives through documents, paintings and objects

Learning Objectives:

- 1) To find out how life changed for Jewish families in Nazi-occupied Europe in the 1930s
- 2) To learn that there was a rescue operation called Kindertransport
- 3) To explore the historical and religious significance of a single object (spice box)
- 4) To understand the meaning of the term 'refugee'

Workshop structure (1 hour total)

- Establish pupil's current knowledge about world war 2 and the Kindertransport
- Explore the impact of Nazi occupation through painting study
- Discuss the experience of 3 individuals on the Kindertransport
- Learn about a family's experience through object exploration (spice box)
